

RECTOR'S REFLECTION - JANUARY 2025

First, on behalf of the Wardens, the Vestry, the Staff and me - I want to wish you all a Blessed Christmas and a Prosperous New Year!

We are coming off of a beautiful celebration of the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas. A huge THANK YOU to Randy Ruthsatz and Brandon Johnson for their diligence in picking beautiful music, and to the choir and Kaleen Lawrence for sharing their talents during the Christmas Eve Mass!

Another huge THANK YOU to the Altar Guild and those who were deputized on the 22nd in making our church look extra special for the Christmas Season. And to Barb Reszko for a beautiful sermon on what this season of Christmas *should* mean to us! I think often times we forget the sheer number of talented and interested parishioners right in our midst!



During December the Vestry approved our 2025 Budget, which will be given to the parish at our Annual Meeting. We also in the process of receiving another quote on the scope of work for our renovation. In the coming weeks the Properties Committee and the Vestry will take up discussion on the quotes.

January will find us busy in a number of different ways:

Throughout the month of January and into February I will be offering to come by your home to bless it during the Season of Epiphany. As in years past I am not looking to be fed or padding to a mileage reimbursement. This is just a way for us to bring into our homes some of what we do and who we celebrate in church on Sundays. During this business meeting we will present the budget to the parish, vote on our Vestry slate for the class 2028 (Julie Geiger, Rick Doyan, and Mark Pifer). We will also vote on our Convention Delegates (Becky Montague, Brandon Johnson, and Debbie Chase). We will also celebrate Don Hanck, after 19 years as our Treasurer this will be Don's last Annual Meeting with us as he is retiring at the end of 2025. Following our meeting we will have our 3rd Annual Chili Cook-off and a small celebration for Don – please plan to attend and contemplate if you have what it takes to de-throne Kelly Gerhardstein as Grace Church Chili Champ!

As of this writing, we have surpassed our Stewardship goal of \$120,000! THANK YOU to those who made pledges this year towards our church's mission in 2025. A breakdown of the pledges are as follows:


I view photography as a therapeutic lens to practice mindfulness and presence. I hope that in sharing my photos it will impact others in a similar way.



This letter is to thank you for your support of our Erie Shore Network, Inc. Arts and Crafts Class. I hope you enjoy the video presentation with samples of different projects that we have completed over the past year. The arts and crafts projects have been a vital tool in helping our members to maintain their mental health.

As you know, our membership consists of people who suffer with mental illness. Arts and crafts projects are a wonderful way for members to escape from the stresses of life and the anxiety that many times comes with mental illness. Members concentrate on the projects and focus on creating beautiful projects. Once projects are completed, members are filled with pride and accomplishment. They take their projects home with them upon completion and are reminded every day that they can be productive and creative. This program is good for the soul!

With the grant funds that ESN was awarded by Grace Episcopal Church, we were able to purchase art supplies that members would normally not be able to use. The lanterns, potted plants, handmade pillows, jewelry, home decor, upcycling, tote bags, and hanging shelves were a big hit this year! The supplies for these projects can be very costly. It is amazing what power art has to heal, strengthen, and encourage. Members enjoy the projects that they are creating and the socialization that comes with working as a group. There are currently 15-20 members each week for the Arts and Crafts Class. We continue to create art, as well as well-being with the funds we received from Grace Episcopal.

This program is a huge draw for new membership. More and more mental health consumers are finding their way to ESN and taking part in our other activities and programs because of their first visit to Arts and Crafts Class. We are so pleased!

We are hopeful that we can continue to partner with you on future grants to continue to provide this valuable program to our members.

WINTER CONVOCATION

At our 208th Convention, Bishop Jolly cast the vision for our diocese: "Connected in Beloved Community, we seek to be faithful, healthy, effective, and sustainable sharers of the transformative love of Jesus."

Lay and clergy people of all ages from across the diocese are invited to Winter Convocation, **January 31-February 1, 2025**, at Sawmill Creek in Huron to learn tangible skills for how to live out our vision in our faith communities and across the Diocese. We'll be joined by two visiting trainers from The College for Congregational Development (CCD) who will lead us to deepen our faith and build our practical skills for being the church in the world today.

The cost to register is \$50.00 for adults and \$15.00 for children/youth. If interested in attending, please contact Debbie at the Parish Office and she will register you. **The Parish will pay for all participants to attend. The deadline to register is Friday, January 17th.** If we have a group of six or more from Grace, the Diocese will reimburse half of the registration fees.

Childcare and interactive activities for youth will be available.


