

RECTOR'S REFLECTION - FEBRUARY 2025

Usually the February newsletter talks about Lent and joining our sufferings and pains to Jesus' on the cross, but this year Lent is pushed back to March so instead we can talk about the mysteries of Epiphany.

While we celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany on Monday, January 6th, its effects are still felt throughout the season between Christmas and the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas) called Epiphany. This special season in the church's calendar is marked by the Magi following the star to the inn in Bethlehem, the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, and the changing of the water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana, as well as, the Gospel accounts of Jesus performing miracles that only the Messiah was supposed to do. All of these passages are about Jesus making himself and his mission known to his followers and to the world.

This Season of Epiphany could just as easily be called the Season of Evangelization. Both recall Jesus' ministry and our baptismal covenant to know Christ and to make him known to the world through the living out of our baptismal covenant. For the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the Second Sunday of Epiphany we renewed our baptismal covenant where we promised to:

- Continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers (note: this means every Sunday and not just when we feel like it);
- Persevere in resisting evil;
- Proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ;
- Seek and serve Christ in all persons; and
- Strive for justice and peace.

These promises are not just things that sound good that churchy people ought to do, rather they are how we are supposed to live our lives day-in and day-out. Our baptismal covenant is the blueprint for being a Christian in our world today.

In this season of Epiphany we blessed holy water using a prayer that exorcises salt, water, and chalk. These items are then used to bless the homes of parishioners and believers to drive away from it (and them) the power and influence of Satan so that peace, health, and happiness remain therein. If you have never had your home blessed I encourage you to reach out to schedule it and if you have had it done, there is nothing stopping you from having it blessed again. If you are interested please shoot me an email and we can get it scheduled (frseth@gracesandusky.org).

Lastly, as the weather continues to stay cold, please remember that if you cannot make it to church on Sundays because of weather, we do have services throughout the week for you to avail yourself. Mass is where we meet our Lord and where he comes to meet us, it is the place where heaven and earth are joined for that brief time, it is a time of respite from the world and a place to refuel for the day ahead.

At our Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 26th we celebrated Don Hanck, our Treasurer for the last 19 years. Don will be retiring at the end of this year.



The Absalom Jones Fund for Episcopal HBCUs supports two institutions affiliated with The Episcopal Church since the 1800s:



Saint Augustine's ABSALOM JONES FUND University in Raleigh, North Carolina, and Voorhees University in Denmark, South Carolina. In 1804, Absalom Jones became the first African American to be ordained a priest in The Episcopal Church. His witness to the way of Jesus included efforts to abolish slavery and to lift up all those cast down. He understood that education is the key to empowerment. We honor Absalom Jones by supporting our HBCUs, which prepare the talented leaders who will continue the work of building a more just and humane society.

On Sunday, February 9th, at Grace, we will take a special offering for the Absalom Jones Fund and submit it to this vital cause.

ST. PAUL'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH, OREGON, OH

St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Oregon, OH wishes to thank you for your generous outreach grant in 2023-24! Unfortunately, we were unable to use the grant as submitted because Pastor Julie was unable to secure any way to purchase bread for the monthly food pantry at a reasonable cost. Sadly, the bread outlet backed out and Kroger wasn't interested. However, we put the money to great use as it enabled us to purchase the "extras" at the pantry. We recently discovered that we are the only Food for Thought food pantry that consistently offers these items. For example, last year we provided cat and dog food to many families monthly as well as 2 rolls of toilet paper to all who attend. Adult hygiene products (tampons, pads, disposable briefs, bed pads) that cannot be purchased with any government assistance were also very appreciated. The number of families coming to our monthly pantry skyrocketed this year to over 200, where we used to average 150.





After our Annual Meeting on January 26th


We all left with full bellies and not a drop of chili left!
