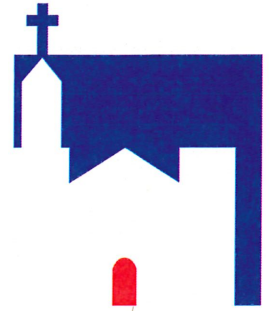

RECTOR'S REFLECTION - SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER 2025

This Newsletter is odd, as we're going to try to combine two months' worth of things into this one! Why? Because I will be on vacation from September 12th through the 24th, and Debbie will be out of the office from September 19th through October 5th – so we're going to try and cram in as much as we can into this, but please keep in mind things change and are fluid so please listen at "Announcement Time" and keep an eye out in the bulletins for things that may not be mentioned or highlighted well in this Newsletter.



For many of you we have been spending some time during our Adult Faith Formation time (yes, it is a thing and we have at 9a on Sundays in the Meeting Room; and take this as your sign to come!) with the podcast *Secular Christ*. While a slightly odd title for a podcast it gets one thinking. Season 3 has been especially thought provoking in that it takes us back to the first two centuries of the Church's existence. We have spent some time listening and discussing the how and the why of the Church's expansion prior to the Edict of Milan in 313AD (the Edict made Christian the "state religion" of the Roman Empire under Constantine). This proliferation of the Church and her teachings happened despite public persecutions and horrific martyrdoms. The natural thought would be that if the Church thrived under persecutions, then it would grow like wildfire in freedom. It did continue to spread, but the bulk of the Church's time was spent in infighting and the labeling of heretics. The discussions that have taken place have wrestled with the question – how do we get back to that infant church's desire and look forward and prepare for the 2nd coming of Jesus (the fancy Greek word *Parousia*)?

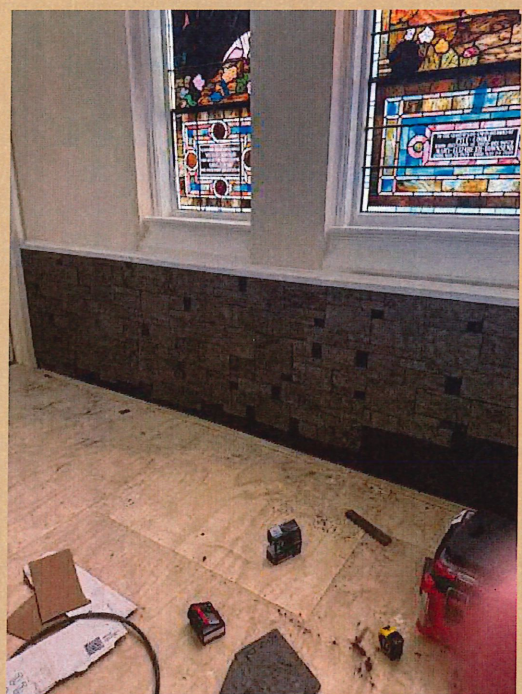

Church Renovation

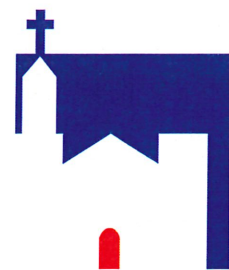


In this seventh installment we are witnessing some of the finishing work.

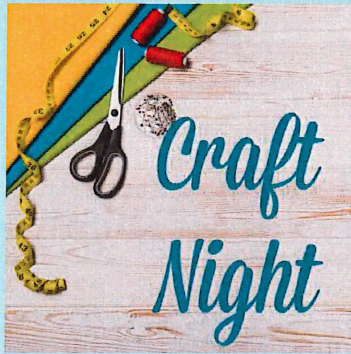
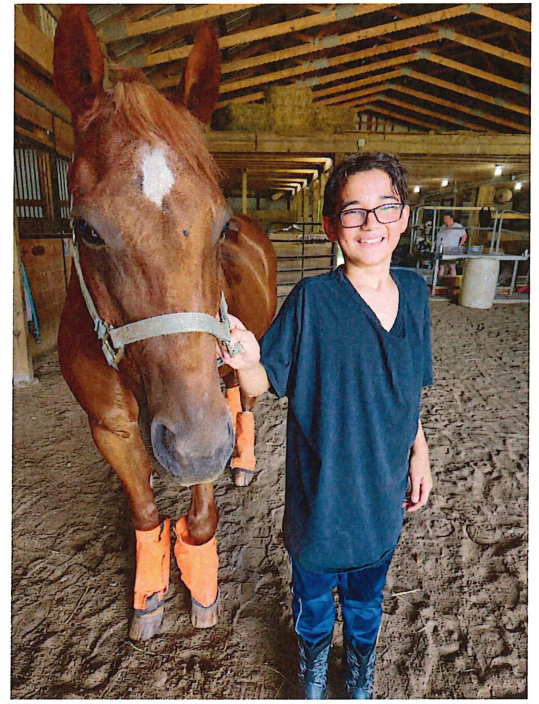
Grace Episcopal Church Outreach Grant 2024 Boots to Grasses Therapeutic Horsemanship Program

Boots to Grasses Therapeutic Horsemanship Program would like to thank Grace Episcopal Church for their grant of \$1500. This generous grant, in addition to other donations, has enabled our program to purchase a new therapy horse – a beautiful Halflinger! As our program has grown exponentially over the past 9 years, the requests for our therapeutic horsemanship services have increased to the point that our waiting list is extremely long. In addition, 2 of our lead therapy horses are over the age of 20. These combined issues highlight our need for a new equine addition to our program. As much as we try to rescue/adopt animals for our program, the search for a therapy horse candidate is complex and often their purchase price is expensive - especially in today's skyrocketing horse market. To state the issue plainly, most horses are not cut out to be therapy horses! We must travel and assess many horses for the unique qualities required for the work Boots to Grasses engages in. The right horse must be "aged" (over 10 years old - many horses live into their 30s), not triggered by external/audial input, non-head shy, and generally willing to accept leaders and side walkers to support the needs of our clients in the saddle.

Boots to Grasses Therapeutic Horsemanship Program is a 501c-3 organization - serving participants at our farm in Berlin Heights, Ohio, founded in 2016. Therapeutic Horsemanship/EAAT – Equine Assisted Activities and Therapies - has provided social, educational, and recreational opportunities to individuals facing challenges for more than a century. By utilizing the special bond between humans and horses, Therapeutic Horsemanship can benefit participants of all ability levels. Boots to Grasses encourages participation of any person - regardless of age or challenge. The discipline of Therapeutic Horsemanship encompasses not simply riding horses but also working to form a bond with the horse on the ground. Classes are taught in a private or group format by a PATH International (Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship) certified instructor with a Bachelor's of Science in Equine Studies and Therapeutic Horsemanship from Lake Erie College - in conjunction with trained volunteers.

Boots to Grasses accepts any participant in our community who is facing a physical, mental, personal, or health challenge. Our enrolled riders enjoy weekly horsemanship sessions on our Berlin Heights Farm. BtG also strives to provide further enrichment and bonding activities for our "BtG Family"! We provide much needed inclusive events with understanding and accommodations for our friends with different needs - such as; The BtG Easter Egg Hunt, Fall Family Fest, Apple Picking Adventure, movie theater trips, Christmas Cookie Decorating Extravaganza, the annual springtime visit to Equine Affaire in Columbus, and our always greatly anticipated Annual Field Trip! We are proud to be a certified provider for the Erie, Huron, and Lorain County Boards of Developmental Disabilities. Boots to Grasses works with groups from Head Start, Christie Lane Industries, and The Link. We are also happy to report that from 2017-2025 BtG has worked with Ability Works Summer Teen Program in which we train young adults with challenges in barn and equine management. Our Ability Works Youth Groups spend 12 weeks with us each summer learning and working. The 2025 Annual Boots to Grasses Easter Egg Hunt welcomed 68 special egg hunters and their families for a ton of ability friendly fun! As the 2024 holidays approached, we photographed and published our annual online Advent Calendar and enjoyed our time sharing our home grown potpourri and handmade soy wax candles at the Mulberry Creek Christkindlmarkt.

The continuing generosity of Grace Episcopal Church is greatly appreciated by everyone in Boots to Grasses. Thank you for your support of so many worthy organizations in our area!

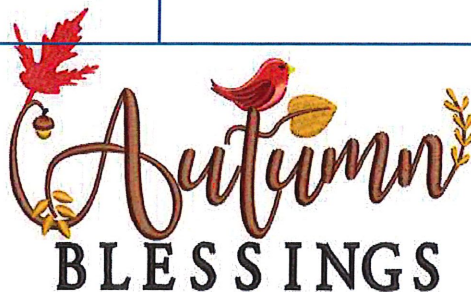

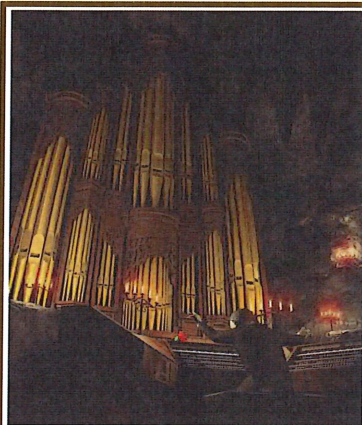
